

Summit Game Instructions & Forms for Trek Coaches

Parental Permission Form: Each participant is **required** to use their Sponsoring Church's Permission Form. Failure to do so will result in the exclusion of the participant from this year's competition.

Team Rosters: Please fill out two Team Roster forms. One to be turned in at registration and one to be kept by the coach during the game.

Day Event Volunteer Form: All Volunteers including Coach, Assistant Coach, and Scorekeeper must fill out the attached Day Event Volunteer Form and personally submit to the registration table at the time of registration.

Volunteer Service Pin Order Form: Please turn in your order form for Volunteer Service Pins at the Volunteer Staff Check-in area. Service Pins are **free** to Coaches, Line Judges, Scorekeepers, Timers, Equipment persons, and the other support staff positions we require.

In the event that your commander or another designated person is not taking care of the following issues, they are the responsibility of the COACH.

All Churches MUST provide Volunteers for each Team registered:

Coach (1 male or female)	Trained at scheduled "Event Training Day" (team earns 2 points)
Scorekeeper (1 Female)	Trained at scheduled "Event Training Day" (team earns 2 points)
Line Judge (1 Male)	Trained at scheduled "Event Training Day" (team earns 2 points)
Volunteers (3 male or female)	Trained day of event (team earns 2 points each volunteer)
Assistant Coach (1 male or female)	(Optional - no additional points earned)

Volunteer Staff Descriptions (all must check-in):

Scorekeeper: All scorekeepers must be female and attended the "Event Training Day". Prefer adults but responsible high school students may serve. Should be able to add accurately and quickly.

Outside Security: Male or female adult making sure all adults and participants are obeying the campus/venue rules, as well as, watching for suspicious activity and loitering. ***This volunteer will not be able to watch the games during their assignment.*** They may volunteer either before or after their team is competing.

Restroom Security: Male or female adult required to monitor their gender appropriate restroom. ***This volunteer may not be able to watch the games during their assignment, due to the location of the restrooms.*** However, they may volunteer either before or after their team is competing.

Inside Security/Grandstand: Male or female adult responsible for helping with crowd control at the doors and above and below the bleachers. No food or drinks are allowed in the gym and everyone should be wearing a wristband unless they are on a team.

Equipment: Male or female adult or responsible teen **who has working knowledge of the games.** Responsible for setting up/handing out the game equipment. This person needs to wear tennis shoes.


Timer: Male or female adult or high school student with legible handwriting. We do not use timers during the Sparks Summit Games.

Programs: Male or female adult or responsible teen to stand inside the gym doors and hand out programs to those who come in. One program per family please.

Love Does Not Rejoice in Iniquity, But Rejoices in The Truth -- We are saddened when another player on our team wants to “get even” for a bump he received from another team’s player.

Love Bears All Things – We thank God for the chance to grow up a little when we fall in the first lap of the 3 – Legged Race.

Love Believes All Things – When we are knocked down in the Beanbag Grab, our first thought is that it was an accident, and that it was not deliberate.

Love Hopes All Things – We do not know the word “defeat”. Even when we finish last, we can see something good about it, and are ready to try again. 

Love Endures All Things – When our team goes through the whole Summit Games, and does not even win one event, we know we did our best, and go home with a good feeling because of that.
