## COVID-19 PROCEDURES FOR GUEST GROUPS

Victory Ranch is committed to the health, safety, and well-being of our guests, campers, and staff. The camp will be taking reasonable steps and precautions to protect those attending camp, including following state and local guidelines. In order to do so, we ask that all guest groups adhere to the following procedures:

1. All attendees should arrive healthy and symptom free. Anyone known to have been exposed to COVID-19 during the 14 days before camp and/or who has had symptoms within 10 days before camp should remain at home and not attend.
2. All attendees should complete a health screening during the check-in process and/or prescreen themselves prior to arrival. These screenings should include self-monitoring for symptoms; temperature checks; and questions about recent symptoms, illness, or known exposure to any disease.
3. Any individual who develops symptoms while at camp should be separated from the general camp population and sent home as soon as possible or taken to a medical care facility if needed.
4. Masks or face coverings should be worn in accordance with current state and local guidance.
5. Everyone should be encouraged to follow good hygiene practices, including washing their hands frequently with soap and warm water, covering their mouth when they cough or sneeze, and not sharing personal belongings. Hand sanitizer stations are available at various locations around the camp.
6. Certain locations are limited to a lower than normal occupancy in order to allow for 6 feet of distancing between individuals. Signs are posted on the doors where applicable.
